The Directors are pleased to present their Report on the business and operations of the Company along with the Audited accounts for the financial year ended 31st March, 2013.

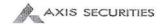
FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE:

BUSINESS OVERVIEW & REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

The markets, after a subdued start to the financial year, moved higher in the latter half of the year only to correct sharply in the last 2 months of the year ending the year with a gain of 7.31%. The sentiment of the market was raised high with change of the Finance Minister at the Centre. However, the economic data pouring in month after month, rising Current Account Deficit, political uncertainty, inflation, weakness in economies and financial turmoil across the world, especially the Europe ensured volatility in the markets and kept investors away from riskier assets in India. The Government offerings through OFS route too did not evoke satisfactory response despite being priced below the prevailing market price. The retail participation fell further, both in direct equities as well as in Mutual funds. Domestic Institutions remained sellers almost throughout the year while Fils remained net buyers.

The Company began right sizing its Branches and started focusing on the Franchisee Channel to expand its reach. These efforts are expected to yield results in the year ahead. The Company also continued its efforts towards reducing costs and was able to reduce the recurring costs by approximately Rs350 lakhs or 18.65 % of costs compared to the previous year. The Board would continue to monitor costs going forward too.

The Company acquired and was allotted Trading and self clearing membership of MCX-SX. Besides equity broking and distribution activities the Company also focused on offering currency derivatives to its clients.

YEAR AHEAD ..

We are conscious of the challenges faced by economies across the world and the steps being taken by respective Governments and Central Banks to tide over their financial problems. India too faces challenges in terms of lower growth arising from government policies, inflation, high interest rates, lower exports and resultant Current Account Deficit. However, we are hopeful that the policy decisions announced and actions being taken by the Government should help India turn around back to higher to higher growth very soon. Political uncertainty and forthcoming general elections would continue to fuel

uncertainty. While India's domestic consumption story still remains good, right decisions and prompt action by the government remains a key to growth. We would like to look forward to the coming year with cautious optimism and would take steps to supplement core broking income by widening our product offerings and reach.

The Company continues to explore opportunities to service clients directly and shall setup broking branches close to Retail asset centres and cities where High net worth customers have presence.

CHANGE OF CONTROL

The Board of Directors of Company's erstwhile holding Company ENAM Securities Private Limited in its meeting held on 17th November 2010 had approved transfer of its financial service business including its investments in its subsidiary companies including your Company to Axis capital Limited (Formerly Axis Securities and Sales Limited) wholly owned subsidiary of Axis Bank Limited. Reserve Bank of India while approving such transfer has stipulated certain conditions which included first transfer of Financial service business of ENAM including investments in subsidiaries to Axis Bank Limited and then to Axis Capital Limited. The whole process was completed on 19th October 2012 and with effect from 20th October 2012, the Company became subsidiary of Axis Capital Limited. To reflect the change in control the name of the Company was changed to Axis Securities Limited. The Directors are pleased to note that during the year, the Company received approval from the regulators and Exchanges, viz. SEBI, NSE and BSE for change in control as per the scheme of merger/ demerger and change in the name of the Company to Axis Securities Limited.

MERGER SCHEME

The Board of Directors of the Company and our holding Company Axis Capital Limited has decided to merge the retail business of Axis Capital Limited into the Company through a scheme of arrangement under section 391 to 394 of the Companies Act, 1956 by way of a court process. The scheme is pending for approval of court. The execution of arrangement is contingent based on satisfactory approval from the respective

regulatory authorities. The final step of merger of Retail broking operations of Axis Capital Limited is expected to be completed in the next 2 months.

DIRECTORS

On 20th October 2012, the Board of Directors of the Company was reconstituted; Mr Vallabh Bhanshali resigned as Director of the Company. Mr Ramesh Kumar Bammi, Mr Jagdish Master, Mr Nilesh Shah, Mr Arun Thukral and Mr Modan Saha were appointed as Directors of the Company.

The Directors place on record their warm appreciation for valuable contributions made by Shri Vallabh Bhanshali, the outgoing Director.

DIVIDEND

Your Directors do not recommend any dividend for the year ended on 31st March 2013.

RESERVES

In view of loss, no amount is transferred to Reserves.

SHARE CAPITAL:

During the year, Authorised Share Capital of the Company has been increased from Rs. 23,00,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Three crores only) to Rs. 43,00,00,000 (Rupees Forty Three Crores Only) divided in 2,30,00,000 (Two Crores Thirty Lacs) Equity Shares of Rs. 10/- each (Rupees Ten Only) and 20,00,000 (Twenty Lacs) 5% Redeemable Non-Cumulative Preference Shares of Rs. 100/- each (Rupees One Hundred Only), by creation of 2,00,00,000 (Two crores) new equity Shares of Rs. 10/- each, ranking pari passu with the existing Equity Shares of the Company.

The preference shares are in the process of being converted into convertible preference shares and further to be converted into 2,00,00,000 Equity Shares of Rs 10/- each i.e. 10 Equity shares of Rs. 10/- each for every one Preference Shares of Rs. 100/- each subject to necessary approvals.

During the year under review, the Company has not earned any foreign exchange and neither incurred any expenditure in Foreign exchange.

The Company had received special notices from two shareholders of the Company recommending the appointment of M/s. S. R. Batliboi & Co. LLP, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for the Financial Year 2013-2014. The Company has also received a certificate from M/s. S. R. Batliboi & Co. LLP about their eligibility for appointment as Statutory Auditors as per Section 224(1B) of the Companies Act, 1956. The Board recommends the appointment of M/s. S. R. Batliboi & Co. LLP, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai, as Statutory Auditors of the Company for the Financial Year 2013-14.

Note: 19 Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Accounts

A. Draft Accounting Policies

1. Basis of Preparation:

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis in compliance with all material aspect of the Accounting Standard notified by Companies Accounting Standard Rules, 2006 and relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the company and are consistent with those used in the previous year

2. Change in Accounting Policy:

In the current year, the Company changed (with retrospective effect) its method of providing depreciation on fixed assets, other than those at project sites and leasehold land and buildings, from the Written Down Value ('WDV') method at the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956 to the Straight Line Method (SLM) at the rates based on technical estimates of useful life. The management believes that such change will result in a more appropriate presentation of these assets and will give a systematic basis of depreciation charge more representative of the time pattern in which the economic benefits will be derived from the use of such asset.

Had the Company continued to use the earlier basis of providing depreciation, the charge to the Statement of Profit and Loss after taxation for the current period would have been lower by Rs. 1,596,857 and the net block of fixed assets would correspondingly have been higher by Rs.1,596,857. The net expense of Rs.627,914 (after adjusting deferred tax credit of Rs. 627,914) arising out of retrospective re-computation has been recognized in the current years Statement of profit and loss.

3. Accounting Estimates:

The preparation of Financial Statements requires management to make estimates and assumption that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting year end. Although these estimates are based upon management best knowledge of current event and actions, actual results could defer from these estimates.

4. Fixed Assets:

Fixed Assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.

5. Depreciation:

Depreciation on fixed assets has been provided on Straight Line basis on the useful lives estimated by the management, or at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of The Companies Act, 1956 whichever is higher. Depreciation on the fixed assets added/ disposed off/ discarded during the year has been provided on pro—rata basis with reference to the date of addition/ disposal/ discarding. The intangible assets(software) are amortized on a straight line basis over a period of five years. The Company has used the following rates to provide depreciation n its fixed assets

6. Impairment of Assets:

The Carrying Amounts of assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/ external factors. An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of assets exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss if any is charged to Profit and Loss Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. Reversal of impairment losses recognised in prior years is recorded when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognised for the assets no longer exist or have decreased.

7. Borrowing Cost:

Borrowing Cost attributable to acquisition and construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as a part of the cost of such asset upto the date when such asset is ready for its intended use. Other borrowing costs are charged to Profit and Loss account.

8. Translation of Foreign Currency Items:

Transactions in foreign currency are recorded at the rate of exchange prevailing on the date of transaction. The resulting exchange gain loss is recognized in the Profit & Loss Account. Foreign currency monetary items are reported using closing rate of exchange at the end of the year. Other items like investment in equity shares are carried in terms of Historical Cost using the exchange rate at the date of transaction.

9. Investments:

Investments are classified into long term investments and current investments. Investments which are intended to be held for more than one year are classified as long term investments and investments which are intended to be held for less than one year are classified as current investments. Long Term Investments are stated at cost after deducting provision made, if any, for other than temporary diminution in the value. Current Investments are stated at lower of cost and market/ fair value.

10. Inventories:

Inventories relating to Dealing Errors are valued at lower of cost or market value.

11. Revenue Recognition:

Revenue is recognized when it is earned and no significant uncertainty exists as to its realization or collection. Brokerage received from Secondary market operations are recognized on the trade date of the transaction. Depository Fees are recognized on completion of the transaction. Dividend income is accounted when the right to receive the payment is established. Interest Income is recognized in the Profit & Loss Account as it accrues. Portfolio Management Fees are accounted on accrual basis as follows:

In case of fees based on fixed percentage of the corpus/ fixed amount, income is accrued at the end of the quarter/ month.

In case of fees, based on the returns of the portfolio, income is accounted on each anniversary as per the agreement.

12. Retirement and Other Employee Benefits

a. Defined Contribution Plan

The company makes defined contribution to Provident Fund which are recognized in the Profit & Loss Account on accrual basis.

b. Defined Benefit Plan

The Company's Liability under Payment of Gratuity Act (funded) is determined on the basis of actuarial valuation made at the end of each financial year. Actuarial gain and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of Profit and Loss Account as income or expense. Obligation is measured at the present value of estimated future cash flows using a discounted rate that is determined by reference to market yields at the Balance Sheet date on Government bonds where the currency and terms of the Government bonds are consistent with the currency and estimated terms of the defined benefit obligation.

c. Provision for Leave Salary

- a. Accumulated leave, which is expected to be utilized within the next 12 months, is treated as short-term employee benefit. The Company measures the expected cost of such absences as the additional amount that it expects to pay as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the reporting date.
- b. The Company treats accumulated leave expected to be carried forward beyond twelve months, as long-term employee benefit for measurement purposes. Such long-term compensated absences are provided for based on the actuarial valuation using the projected unit credit method at the year end.

13. Taxation:

Tax expenses comprises of current, deferred and fringe benefit tax. Provision for current tax is made on the basis of estimated taxable income for the current accounting year in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961.

The deferred tax for timing differences between the book and tax profit for the year is accounted for, using the tax rate and laws that have been substantively enacted as of the balance sheet date

Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences are recognised to the extent there is a reasonable certainty that these would be realised in future.

Deferred tax assets are recognised in case of unabsorbed losses and unabsorbed depreciation only if there is virtual certainty that such deferred tax asset can be realised against future taxable profits.

14. Operating Leases:

Leases, where significant portion of risk and reward of ownership are retained by the Lessor, are classified as Operating Leases and lease rentals thereon are charged to the Profit and Loss Account as per terms of Lease - Agreements on a straight line basis over the lease term.

15. Contingent Liabilities & Provisions

Contingent Liabilities are possible but not probable obligation as on the Balance Sheet date, based on the available evidence. Provisions are recognised when there is a present obligation, as a result of past event, and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet Date.

(iv) In the current year, the Company has retrospectively changed its method of providing depreciation on fixed assets, other than those at project sites and leasehold land and buildings, from the Written Down Value ('WDV') method at the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956 to the Straight Line Method (SLM) at the rates based on technical estimates of useful life. The management believes that such change will result in a more appropriate presentation of these assets and will give a systematic basis of depreciation charge more representative of the time pattern in which the economic benefits will be derived from the use of such asset.

Had the Company continued to use the earlier basis of providing depreciation, the charge to the Profit and Loss Account after taxation for the current period would have been lesser by Rs. 1,596,857 and the net block of fixed assets would correspondingly have been higher by Rs. 1,596,857. The net deficit of Rs.627,914 arising out of retrospective recomputation has been recognized in the current year's statement of profit and loss.
